## STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER – JUNE 3, 2020

The terms of this Second Addendum and the Seventh Notice of Public Health Order and its first Addendum dated May 27, 2020 shall remain in effect through July 3, 2020. Where the terms of this Addendum conflict with the terms of the Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order and its Addendum dated May 27, 2020, the terms of this Second Amendment shall control.

Houses of Worship. Effective June 5, 2020, houses of worship may open to 50% of the posted occupancy limit indoors not to exceed 50 people, whichever is less, while meeting the 6 feet distancing requirements in every direction between non-household members. Any additional rooms in the house of worship may host up to 10 people implementing 6 feet distancing requirements. For outdoor worship services, a house of worship must maintain 6 feet distance between non-household members and work with the appropriate local authority to obtain approval for the maximum number of individuals who may attend in the designated outdoor space. Houses of worship shall also meet the following requirements: Face coverings must be worn by staff, volunteers and congregants while on the premises of the house of worship, except for children 2 years old and under, those with trouble breathing, or those unable to remove a mask without assistance. Houses of worship must follow the Colorado Department of Health and Environment Cleaning Guidance, as well as the CDC guidelines for Cleaning and Disinfecting Your Facility in preparing their buildings prior to, during, and following any gathering. Restrooms and the worship space, particularly any metal or plastic on chairs, and all high touch surfaces or shared objects must be disinfected between services. Each House of Worship must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance to address capacity, physical/social distancing, masks and cleaning practices.

**Outdoor Recreation.** The following types of recreational activity shall adhere to the described limitations and requirements:

**Guided Services**. Group sizes are limited to 10 clients/customers. Guide services for fishing, hunting, biking, horseback riding, canoeing, kayaking, stand up paddle boarding, ATV tours, and climbing are permitted in groups no larger than 10. River outfitters, rafting, or Jeep Tours in groups of up to 2 households in a boat or jeep only in groups of no more than 10. All guide service providers, outfitters and other similar services must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance to address capacity, physical/social distancing, masks and cleaning practices.

**Ski Areas.** Ski areas may open for skiing and summer activities upon approval of the COVID-19 Business Safety Plan. Area operators must work with Public Health to submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance to address capacity, physical/social distancing, masks and cleaning practices.

**Playgrounds.** Beginning June 1, 2020, playgrounds, skateboard parks, racquet sports and other non-league, non-coached, informal park usage are open with the underlying land owner or operator of the playground posting a maximum capacity based upon

social distancing requirements and the size of the playground. High touch areas should be cleaned and disinfected frequently. Playground operators must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance.

**Organized Recreational Sports.** Beginning June 8, 2020, organized recreational youth or adult league sports may begin with a maximum number of participants of 25 for outdoor events and 10 for indoor events. Parents may attend youth sports activities but must remain 6 feet apart from non-household members. Spectators are strongly discouraged for adult sports. The sports league must retain records of who played in case later disease outbreak investigations become necessary. League administrators must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance.

**Outdoor Pools and Outdoor Developed Hot Springs**. Beginning June 8, 2020, these facilities may operate with a maximum capacity of 50% or 50 individuals, whichever is less. Bathrooms and showers can remain open but the lockers must remain closed. Frequently touched surfaces, shared objects, and bathrooms should be cleaned and disinfected every hour. Pool operators must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance.

**Gyms, Recreation Centers, Indoor Pools and Indoor Developed Hot Springs**. Beginning June 8, 2020, these facilities may open, with no more than 10 people per room, maintaining 6 feet distancing. Sharing of equipment is discouraged, and equipment must be cleaned and disinfected between uses. Restrooms and showers are open, while lockers remain closed. Businesses must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance.

**Travel for Recreation.** Recreational travel is recommended but not required to be limited within an individual's local community. If recreational travel is taken outside an individual's local community, it is the responsibility of each person who is traveling to familiarize themselves with the host community regulations and to follow those regulations while visiting and recreating.

**Children's Day Camps and Youth Sports Camps**. Effective June 1, 2020, children's day camps, youth sports camps and exempt single skill-building youth camps may open in accordance with the requirements established by the State. Camp operators must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance. Residential camps are not authorized to open at this time.

**Short Term Rental.** Short term is defined as 30 days or less. Private rental by owners who are not licensed or of properties not managed by a professional property manager, are permitted as of June 22 with limits on capacity that are detailed in sector-specific guidance. Anyone providing a short-term rental must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using sector-specific guidance.

In addition to all other requirements applicable to short term lodging, operators of facilities that have shared bathrooms or food preparation facilities, including but not limited to hostels, mountain huts, or similar facilities, must inform guests about the restrictions in this Order, including by: Providing all guests with information about the Five Commitments of Containment explaining the Special Provisions for Visitors in the Addendum to the Seventh Notice of Public Health Order.

**Personal Services.** Personal services as defined in the Seventh Notice of Public Health Order, may operate with no more than 50 people at a time or a maximum of 50% occupancy, whichever is fewer.

Public and Private Gatherings. Effective June 15, all public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring outside a residence are limited to no more than fifty (50) individuals, except for the purposes expressly permitted in the Seventh Amended Notice of Public Health Order, which include Necessary Activities. Nothing in this Order prohibits the gathering of members of the same household. Any gathering requiring any type of government permit shall have an approved event specific COVID-19 Event Safety Plan. Businesses holding gatherings of up to 50 people must submit and adhere to a COVID-19 Business Safety Plan using event-specific guidance. Informal gatherings of up to 50 people must follow the 5 Commitments to Containment and informal gathering guidelines. For events requiring staff, the 50 person gathering limits only apply to attendees.

The Pitkin County Public Health Department is tasked with protecting the health and welfare of the residents and visitors of Pitkin County, Colorado by investigating and controlling the causes of epidemic and communicable disease. This Addendum is necessary to control any potential transmission of disease to others. See section 25-1-508, Colorado Revised Statutes. Immediate issuance of this Order is necessary for the preservation of public health, safety, or welfare.
